# Resources for Music

## 1. Books

**Books on music can be found in the Chapel wing, First floor.** All music books have classmarks **beginning with M**. The oversize sequence starts on the left hand side as you enter the Chapel wing and is followed by the normal sequence.

A broad outline of the arrangement of music follows:

ML 385-429	Composers and performers

## 2. Journals

All of the Library's journal holdings, listed by subject, are available via the website:

The Library takes one music journal: *Music Analysis*. Bound parts are on the First floor at M 5.A5 and unbound parts in the Current Periodicals Area on the Ground floor. The Library also takes the *Musica Britannica series*, which may be found in the oversize sequence at M.I.M8.

E-journals can be searched via *Cambridge LibGuides* (see below for more information).

### 3. *Audiovisual materials*

**The Library has a growing collection of AV materials.** These may be found in the AV Room on the First floor, which is open during staffed hours for browsing the collection. Facilities are available in this room for viewing videos/DVDs and listening to CDs for study purposes. AV materials may be borrowed for one week and renewed once.

All AV items are on the library catalogue and may be found using the standard author and title searches. Copies of a separate printed listing of AV items is located in the AV room and at the Issue Desk.
