\rightarrow Visa

SJTU will provide students with JW 202 and Admission Notice. Applicant should bring the visa paperwork, Admission Notice, JW 202 form and a valid passport to the local Chinese embassy or consulate to apply for a short term student visa (usually the visa type "X 2"). Those who are already in China need to submit a copy of the visa page, residence registration notice and the above application documents to the PCB in Shanghai after registering at SJTU.

The JW 202 form and the admission notice will be sent to the applicant by the international courier within two weeks after April 30, 2017.

* If you are a local student from Hong Kong, Macao and Taiwan, you do not need the JW202 form.

→ Insurance

Students who plan to attend this program should have obtained insurance before they come to study in China. Each student needs to present the insurance certificate to the administrative staff on the registration day.

→ Transcript

Official transcripts will be sent out in September to the mailing address you indicated in the application. Students who wish to transfer credits need to obtain pre-approval from the relevant authorities at their home universities.

Course Description »

This course aims to introduce urban horticulture in China to participants and further to the world, including the history, development, current status, and the future of Chinese and Shanghai urban horticulture, including the culture of China and Shanghai. The goal is to establish an "International trend, Global demand, Chinese Strategy, Shanghai Strength, and SJTU brand".

By the end of this 2-week study experience, students should have basic knowledge and understanding of the rich history, flourishing present, and bright future of urban horticulture in Shanghai and in China.

Dr. Jiang Lu is a professor in the School of Agriculture and Biology, "Zhiyuan Endowed Professor" of Shanghai Jiao Tong University, and an oversea expert recruited in China for "the Thousand Talents Plan". He received his Ph.D. degree from the University of Reading in the UK in 1990 and worked as postdoctoral research associate in Cornell University. Prior to his arrival at SJTU, Dr. Lu was a professor at China Agricultural University. Before joining the faculty at CAU in 2013, he was a professor at Florida A&M University where he worked for 20 years. He currently serves as Associate Editor for the journal of "Annual Reviews of Horticultural Science" and "the Journal of Fruit Trees," China.

Before joining the faculty at UIUC in 1997, he worked in Caterpillar Inc. as a Senior Research Engineer. He currently serves as the Editor-in-Chief for Computers and Electronics in Agriculture, and the Chair for Section III (Plant Production Equipment) of CIGR.

Dean Professor Yang Zhong is a Changjiang Chair Professor rewarded by the Chinese Ministry of Education, Zhiyuan Chair Professor at Shanghai Jiao Tong University and Tenured professor of Political Science at the University of Tennessee. His main research interests include local governance in China, political culture, and political participation. He is co- author of two scholarly books: Local Government and Politics in China (M. E. Sharpe, 2003) and Political Culture and Participation in Rural China (Routledge Press, 2012).

Course Description

This course focuses on current important issues in Chinese political development and government reform with an interdisciplinary approach to examining China. Through seminars, field trips, and other activities, students have the opportunity to experience traditional Chinese culture and conduct in-depth analysis of public policy with Chinese experts. It covers the following area: public policy analysis; city of Shanghai governance case studies; field trip to visit urban communities; traditional cultural activities including a tea ceremony, calligraphy, and or Chinese cooking.

Global Summer School 09

China's Policy on Climate Change, Energy and Environment

Duration: 2017.7.6-2017.7.20 (2 weeks)

Campus: **Xuhui**

Course Description

This course explores the challenges associated with climate change, energy and environmental policies from multiple perspectives, disciplines and scales. Students will be trained to examine the evolving science and policy of climate change, tussles among big global emitters regarding commitments and responsibility, and the conflicts between energy giants and interest groups in China. Additionally, China's energy and environmental policies will be scrutinized in a context of global and domestic politics. Through various case studies, students are encouraged to grasp the nature of China's national development strategies and the risks and challenges the country is facing in implementing its "green policies". At the same time, students will be expected to apply theories of IPE and PE while conducting analysis.

Highlight

Understand the interaction between politics and economics, especially in a Chinese context;

Understand the economic dimension of foreign policy and international politics regarding energy and environmental issues;

Understand the interaction between mitigation, energy efficiency and technology innovation;

Integrate different stakeholder perspectives, disciplines, scales and geographic contexts in evaluating China's mitigation efforts, energy and environmental policies;

Understand China's develomentalist approach and the shift from a GDP-orientation to a more balanced development;

Develop both oral and written communication skills to facilitate systematic analysis and effective consideration of these complex issues.





Course Description

The course Traditional Chinese Medicine and Culture aims to introduce the characteristic theories and thoughts of traditional Chinese Medicine, characteristic therapies of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM), processing of Chinese medical material, study of traditional Chinese medicine as well as the history and the social and cultural background of traditional Chinese medicine, and spreading the knowledge and culture of traditional Chinese medicine.

Understand the Yin-Yang thought and Wu Xing theory of traditional Chinese medicine;

Experience Acupuncture;

Teach and Practice Taijiquan;

Introduce the methods for nourishing of life and improve physical and mental health.

Dr. Chongsheng Peng, associate professor in the School of Pharmacy at Shanghai Jiao Tong University (SJTU), and is an expert of both SJTU General Education course and storehouse of China Association of Pharmaceutical Education (CAPE). He received his Ph.D. at the West China University of Medical Science and Bachelor's degree from Anhui University of Chinese Medicine. He was a visiting scholar (2005-2006) at the Institute of Molecular Bioscience (IMB), University of Queensland. Also, his course "Traditional Chinese Medicine & Chinese Culture" has been regarded as key course for general education in Shanghai since April, 2015, and key course at SJTU since 2012. The course is also available globally on the four MOOC platforms of Coursera, China MOOC (CNMOOC), Zhihuishu and Ewant. The English version of this course was successfully developed to be the first international course with blended learning for the Universtas 21 summer school 2016 and attracted more than 130 students on line, and 65 students joining in offline hands-on practices from 18 universities in 11 countries.

Course Description »

This course contains three parts: art, technology and management, with various teaching approaches such as in-class instruction, filed trips, case analysis and multi-cultural perspectives, to inspire students' creativity. Artists, designers, and entrepreneurs from the creative industry in China and abroad work together to launch this four-week Chinese culture and creative industry experience program. While learning from master artists and senior designers, and entrepreneurs, students will have the opportunity to accomplish a design project from a Chinese enterprise under the guidance of masters, and seek possible career opportunities in China.

Professor Renzuo Zhan, is a master of Chinese Flower-and Bird Painting. His works are collected by Chinese and foreign dignitaries, such as William Jefferson Clinton (42nd President of the USA), Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela (famous Anti-apartheid Revolutionary Politician), Lee Kuan Yew (1st Prime Minister of Singapore), Nakasone Yasuhiro (71st - 73rd Prime Minister of Japan), Chen-Ning Franklin Yang (Winner of 57th Nobel Prize in Physics), etc. Since 1996, Professor Zhan has been teaching Chinese Painting on the Education TV Channel. He has published dozens of teaching textbooks, among which Chinese Flower and Bird Painting Introduction won the Outstanding Publication Award issued by China's Ministry of Education and General Administration of Press and Publication. He is honored as "the most popular professor" by Shanghai Jiao Tong University.

Mr. Qi Wang is a representative of the young Chinese painters born in the 1970s. In his early years, he studied painting with the world renowned watercolor master Chen Chi, from whom he received the skill of "applying western learning on the foundation of Chinese culture." In the past decade, he studied with Zhan Renzhuo, the master of Chinese flower and bird painting, with a focus on the traditional painting and calligraphy. For more than twenty years, he has been devoted to art and teaching art courses at Shanghai Jiao Tong University, a school famous for its science and engineering disciplines. After studying the essence of the modern western painting, he has refocused on Chinese traditional painting and calligraphy. By developing an original set of expressions, Wang has become a unique talent in the Chinese painting circle.


