Prizes, Scholarships & Studentships

- 123 St John's College Studentships have been awarded to students with household income up to £42,620. 88 of these students have received a Studentship at the highest rate, which is £7,100 for the academic year 2019-20. The total amount awarded is £750,000.
- 15 undergraduate students with Overseas / EU fee status have received top-up funding with a St John's Bursary.
- International scholarships: 7 American, 1 South African and 4 Hong Kong undergraduates are in receipt of scholarships to cover part or all of the cost of their studies.

Exchanges

- 116 applications have been submitted for exchange programmes with Caltech, NUS, Georgetown, Pavia, Heidelberg, Nagoya and the China-UK Development Centre (CUDC).
- Visiting students from the Nagoya University in Japan will be in College between 29 February and 14 March.

Key Data / Facts and Figures

- St John's welcomed 181 new Undergraduates and 104 Graduate students new to St John's in October 2019. In addition, 36 Johnians (both former undergraduates and those who had been on a one-year graduate course) returned in October to commence new courses.
- 88 Scholars were admitted to the Foundation in November.
- 210 students sat College Progress Tests in January 2020.
- 497 Graduate Applications were received for entry in October 2019.

Graduate Matters

 The College Matriculation Ceremony for Graduate Freshers took place on Friday 11th October in the Old Library, prior to the Dinner for New Graduate Students. Professor Whitmarsh, as Vice-Master, greeted the new students individually.



 St. John's participated in the University's Postgraduate Open Day, as usual. The Tutor for Graduates and the Graduate Administrator held a drop-in session in the Central Hall of the Old Divinity School during the morning of Friday 1st November. There was a very good response from the current Graduate Student population when they were asked to help at the event and the visitors enjoyed talking to the Current Graduate Student Volunteers about life in St. John's.


- The Travel Exhibitions and Grants competition will be advertised to students in the week of 17th February with a deadline on 23rd March 2020.

Previously, Dr Roland was a Career Development Fellow in the Economics Department at the University of Oxford and Somerville College. She received her BSc in Economics at the Katholieke Universiteit Leuven, Belgium, and her PhD at the London School of Economics and Political Science. Her current research is focused on the impact of financial factors on productivity and growth at the firm level and their consequences for aggregate economic

performance. She also works on management practises and trade in financial services. Prior to her PhD, Isabelle worked in the Economic Consulting practice of LECG where she worked on a number of projects on regulatory and competition economics for clients in the telecommunications, utilities, and financial sectors. She also worked as a Research Analyst at the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development covering Central and Eastern Europe.
