## INTRODUCTION

This booklet contains information about our choral services this term. We are a Church of England foundation, and you are most welcome to join us, whatever your beliefs. Our beautiful Gilbert Scott Chapel, built in the 1860s, is a distinctive feature of the Cambridge skyline and home to the College's celebrated choral tradition that dates from the 1670s.

Evensong is at 6.30pm unless otherwise shown. It follows the order of the 1662 Book of Common Prayer and usually lasts 40 minutes, except on Sundays when it lasts just under an hour and includes a sermon. The Sunday morning Eucharist is in contemporary language and lasts around 75 minutes.

We share this planet with all living things, and we are beginning to understand fully our deep inter-connectedness to nature and the environment. We reflect on the blessings of the earth, sky and sea and we welcome theologians and environmentalists who will explore the spirituality and the expanse of nature, help us discover what we can learn from our wonderful world, and encourage us to become enablers of new life in all its fullness.
