## INTRODUCTION

This booklet contains detailed information about our choral services, organ recitals and other concerts this term. We are a Church of England foundation, but you are most welcome to join us, whatever your beliefs. The Chapel, built in the 1860s by George Gilbert Scott, is a beautiful and spacious place of worship, and we look forward to seeing you here.

Evensong, which is at 6.30pm unless otherwise shown, follows the order of the 1662 Book of Common Prayer. It usually lasts around 40 minutes, except on Sundays when there is a sermon and it lasts around an hour. The Sunday morning Eucharist is in contemporary language. This includes a sermon, and lasts c.75 minutes.

## NEW ORGAN PROJECT

During the coming terms, there will be some disruption to Chapel life as our organ is removed and a new instrument installed. Scaffolding will go up in February and will remain in place until September. Services will continue as normal throughout term time, but capacity will be reduced and there will be no concerts. You will be able to read more about the New Organ Project on the College website in the coming months.

After every service you will be able to give to one of our designated charities, either in cash or by using the contactless payment units in the Ante-Chapel.

## ATTENDING SERVICES

There is no need to reserve a place in advance. You may enter College through either the Great Gate or the Forecourt. Access to the main Chapel is fifteen minutes before the start of the service.

Members of College may wear surplices on Sundays and on other holy days, as marked below by the letter **S** against the date. A supply of these is kept in the Ante-Chapel.
